From The Minister...

Grace and peace to you!

As the snow melts (and the NCAA Final Four approaches!), it's official: spring is here! Though the plants won't bloom for another few weeks, we can see signs around us that are setting the stage for new life to grow. There is danger in this time of year -- particularly with flooding -- but there is also great possibility.

This April, our Lenten sermon series continues its focus on surrender as a transformative spiritual discipline. So far, we have explored three different sides of this issue: how do we let go of our false selves in order that our true selves can emerge? How is God's promise for our lives interwoven with surrender? How are we to understand surrender and its opposite -- i.e. resistance? As we move deeper into this topic, we will be considering the role of surrender at certain places and times in our lives, as well as the meaningfulness and purpose that can arise in the midst of surrender. I encourage you to be with us in worship in the coming weeks, as this series approaches its conclusion on Palm Sunday.

As the sermon series concludes on Palm Sunday (April 17th), we are also entering into Holy Week. This is the time of year when we remember the dangers that Jesus encountered in Jerusalem -- dangers that would eventually cost him his life before leading to the Resurrection. We will be commemorating these events throughout the week, and I encourage you to be with us in worship on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Please also mark your calendars for our Maundy Thursday service on April 21st at 7:30 p.m. There, we will have communion as we remember the event's of the Last Supper, followed by a tenebrae service. "Tenebrae" is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness," and we will explore the shadows of Jesus' passion and death during this service.

During the coming weeks, as we continue to reflect on how Jesus surrendered to his call from God even amid danger, I invite you to consider new possibilities about how you can surrender to God's call for your life, even in hard times. Where is God inviting you to step up into leadership in our church, or in the wider community? Where are the points of resistance in your life, the things that hold you back from doing what you know God is calling you to do? And how can you let go of whatever it is that separates you from the love of God? Throughout the rest of Lent and into Easter, I encourage you to draw nearer to God, being open to new life and growth.

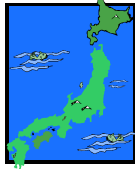
LENTEN SOUP SUPPER

But compared to people whose lives have been ravaged by disaster, or who live on less than \$1 a day, we have a great abundance. On April 3, we will be invited to help people in need around the world and in communities impacted by disasters through the One Great Hour of Sharing® (OGHS) offering. As the church, we are called to help one another, even through the sharing of our own resources. Giving changes so many things, for the receiver and the giver. Can you imagine the joy on a mother's face, who because of your gift, can send her children to school or provide them with a meal before bed? OGHS supports many initiatives that help women start their own businesses or learn a wage-earning skill. You become a partner in these programs through your gift. By sharing our resources, combined with offerings from thousands of other congregations in eight denominations across the United States, we build homes, schools, medical clinics, and clean water and sewage facilities in villages devastated by earthquakes, floods, and poverty; bring safety, shelter, and food to refugees after often violent circumstances have made their hometowns uninhabitable; nurture stronger futures and self-sufficiency through health care, education, job training.

THREE WAYS TO HELP OUR ONE WORLD FAMILY

Men's Coats – THANK YOU for bringing in your gently used men's coats. So far we have collected and delivered 17 coats to the International Institute of Minnesota for refugees arriving in the Twin Cities during these cold winter months. We will continue to collect coats through the month of March with a goal of 20. Please drop them off on Sundays in the choir room or in the main office during the week.

Backpacks for School Age Children - THANK YOU for your donations of backpacks and school supplies. Our Sunday school students have already loaded 14 backpacks with needed school supplies. They will be delivered to the International Institute this week. Please keep those school supplies coming! Watch for a poster in the lounge showing what is still needed. Our goal is to deliver 40 backpacks.

Apartment Set Up and Mentoring - New refugee families are arriving every week. Volunteers are needed to help set up apartments. Apartment set-up includes loading and transporting basic household supplies to the apartment site, grocery shopping, and putting furniture in place. Mentoring is an opportunity to help a family adjust to life in Minnesota by meeting with them regularly over a 3-month period.

STEWARDSHIP DRIVE KICKS OFF APRIL 17TH

In a world of change and uncertainty, we can find comfort in knowing that we have a church community to enrich our souls and foster our spiritual growth, to know that we are always welcome. *Lynnhurst: The Harbor of our Spiritual Community* will be our stewardship theme this year. Our theme reminds us of how truly lucky we are and gives us reason to reflect about those that are less fortunate.

We will present a series of Stewardship Moments during church services, and distribute pledge packets. During the Stewardship Moments, Lynnhurst members will share how our church enriches their lives as well as those of their families, strengthens the community at large, and how the time, talent and financial commitments we all contribute make that possible.

THE MUSIC AND ARTS BOARD PRESENTS TWO EXHIBITS

"THE BLOOM OF THE PRESENT MOMENT" BY ARTIST LIZ

Showing in Fellowship Hall through April 8, 2011. Artist Statement - Painting is my way of exploring the various spaces that are occupied by one's own identity. I am particularly intrigued with the development of form through the relational properties of the past to the present. What does that area look like? In my mind, this space resembles an abstracted map where identity is created by memory and linked together in odd geometric shapes. My paintings are directly informed by this concept through an intuitive process of layering paint and excavating the past. About the Artist - Liz Lang was raised amongst the wheat fields in Western Nebraska. After completing her undergraduate degree in Interior Design from Colorado State University, she migrated north to the great state of Minnesota, and received her post-baccalaureate degree from Minneapolis College of Art and Design. She recently moved her studio out of the city and back to the rhythm of the land.

NEXT UP – A SHOW BY ARTIST LYZ WENDLAND

This exhibit will be on display in the Fellowship Hall Art Gallery from April 9 through May 20. Twin City artist Lyz Wendland uses traditional craft supplies, like fabric, paper, and thread, to produce drawings, prints, paintings and large-scale installations. In describing her work, Lyz states "My work examines the conscious and unconscious idea of recollection, and it reflects the obsessive and repetitive nature of my process . . . a metaphor for memory and lack of memory, I play between two and three-dimensions. The separation between the real of our memories and what we think is real, the familiar and uncertainty, the space in between. I utilize a recurring process and manipulation of materials as an allegory for the method of recollection."

LYNNHURST YOUTH FLY TO WASHINGTON D.C.

In late July, six Lynnhurst Youth will join thirty-five youth from five TRUST churches in flying to Washington D.C. for a Faith and Advocacy Trip. The faith portion of this trip includes exploring other religions and denominations. We will visit a mosque and the National Cathedral. We will also worship at a Shabbat service and a large church called Church of the Savior. Church of the Savior is a congregation that is very active in social justice issues. We will visit with Senators Amy Klobuchar and Al Franken as well as Congressman Keith Ellison. Not only do we hope to find out what these Minnesotans are doing but also what our denominations are lobbying for by meeting with Representatives from UCC and ELCA churches. We will be touring the city and visiting the Smithsonian, Holocaust Museum, Arlington Cemetery and many other sites. We hope to learn from other traditions and to advocate for what we are passionate about.

LYNNHURST UCC CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

27 February 2011 – Moderator Rob Allen called the meeting to order and Rev. David Lindsey led in the opening prayer.

Church Council: Rob Allen described the makeup of the Council and how it acts to govern the church. The Council is composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, the chairs of the standing committees and ad hoc committees, 2 members-at-large and church clergy (non-voting).

Reports From Committees: Rob Allen said that most of the work of the church is done by committees and asked the committee chairs to describe their committee functions and current projects.

Trustees: Mike Peterson said that the Trustees are responsible for church finances and building upkeep and use. The Treasurer and the Financial Secretary report to the Trustees and the committee supervises the Office Manager and Building Manager. The committee also plans the Fall Festival and the Stewardship drive. The Trustees have just finished an audit of church finances and are making plans to streamline financial record keeping.

Diaconate: Jodie Meyer said that the committee is in charge of planning worship activities and the appearance of the sanctuary. The committee has prepared a welcoming packet for new members. It is making arrangements for a new photo directory of members. It arranges rides for people who need help getting to church and it also supports the Parish Nurse program. The committee is making plans for a September 11 memorial service. Nancy Erstad, Lynnhurst Parish Nurse, described her activities in setting up a CPR class and in providing home visits.

Mission Board: Kim Keprios said that 20% of members' stewardship pledges goes to missions and she described the various mission programs. She said that the special project for this year is partnership with the International Institute of Minnesota to help refugees moving to this area. She said that we have put together many backpacks with school gear for refugee children. The Lenten Soup Supper is planned for April 3rd at 5:00 pm. She encouraged all members to become active in mission programs.

Christian Education: Amber Nord said that the committee plans adult and youth education programs. It helped hire new Youth Director, Ashley

Anderson and it recruits Sunday School teachers. It also plans the Halloween Party and helps with the Christmas pageant. The Youth Group is involved with other Trust groups planning a mission trip to Washington D.C., where they will advocate for legislation to discourage bullying and to deal with teen suicide. The committee supervises the Youth Director and the Youth Choir Director.

Music and Arts: Jen Peterson said that the role of the committee is to support the use of the arts and music in the mission of the church. The committee plans the caroling party, and solicits artists for the gallery and hangs their work. The committee also plans the Lynnhurst Home Companion, Congregational Singing programs, liturgical dance, and a Spoken Word program. The committee supervises the Organist and Adult Choir Director.

Personnel Committee: Tristen Lindemann said that the committee was formed in 2007 to coordinate hiring of new employees, to conduct background checks, to do personnel reviews, and to serve as a hearing board for grievances. She encouraged everyone to fill out the employee evaluation forms.

Outreach Committee: Mary Lynum gave a presentation showing the features of the new church website. She displayed the features of both the public site and the members-only site. The public site is already on-line and being used. The members-only part of the site has not been fully developed yet and Lori Nicol will take the lead in its development.

Bylaw Change: Currently the Past Moderator serves as the chair of the Personnel Committee. It was moved and seconded that the Bylaws be changed so that the Past Moderator serves as a member of the Personnel Committee, but not as the chair, and that the chair be selected from within the current membership of the Committee. The motion was approved.

New Business: Rev. David Lindsey said that, as part of the Church's 100th anniversary celebration, we are starting a fund-raising drive for new-church starts in the Minnesota Conference of the UCC. The drive will begin soon and will be completed before the stewardship drive begins.

After a closing prayer by Rev. David Lindsey, the meeting adjourned.
