### **WORSHIP SURVEY RESULTS**



On Sunday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, the Diaconate met to discuss the results of the worship survey. The survey revealed a wide range of diverse thoughts about worship. Still, a few clear themes emerged:

- \* Music, Sermons, and Children's Time are (generally speaking) going well
  - \* There's a desire in our congregation for increased variety and participation in worship
  - \* Prayer, scripture, and ritual are vital to our worship, and we may want to expand upon our current methods of sharing them
  - \* Visual art is an important expression of our faith, and we may want to consider additional ways to introduce art in worship
  - \* The flow of the worship service needs some reconsideration
  - \* Our members consistently want the service to be no more than one hour, but we have some disagreement about how best to make this happen
- In the coming weeks and months, the Diaconate will be exploring different ways to adapt our approach to worship, based on this feedback. Thanks to all who participated!

## MISSION BOARD NEWS:

**MISSION: 1 THAT THEY MAY ALL BE 1:** During the first eleven days of November (11.1.11 – 11.11.11) the national United Church of Christ is embarking on Mission:1. The goal is to spend 11 days focused on feeding the hungry and confronting food-related injustice. All members are encouraged to donate food and other household items to local food banks and outreach services, give to the Neighbors In Need offering or write letters to congress asking our government to reform U.S. foreign assistance in a way that more effectively benefits hungry and poor people worldwide. **One suggestion offered by the Mission Board would be to mindfully set aside one food or financial donation a day during this period and then bring the collection to Think 3 Sunday (November 20<sup>th</sup>) when Lynnhurst normally collects food donations.** If you are interested in writing letters, this website has a sample letter and enables you to look up your legislator <http://www.bread.org/ol/2011/sample-letter.html>. Finally, we will be setting up a trip to Feed My Starving Children in the next couple months. Stay tuned for details.



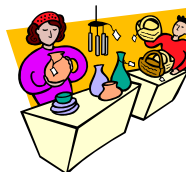
## MORE MISSION BOARD NEWS:

For the second year in a row, the Lynnhurst Mission Board has focused on cooperating with the **International Institute of Minnesota**. Last year, Lynnhurst members successfully filled 40 backpacks with school supplies for refugees new to Minnesota. Furthermore, members were able to donate 20 men's winter coats to refugees new to Minnesota winters. The International Institute of Minnesota also provides home furnishings for refugee families coming to the metro area. Bedding is one of the most needed items for apartment set up. **This year, the Lynnhurst Mission Board is encouraging members to donate sheets, pillowcases, blankets, quilts or pillows that are in good condition.** If you can help out with this project, please bring bedding supplies to the main office or choir room during the months of November and December. The Lynnhurst Mission Board will deliver them to the International Institute for apartment set up. Finally, if you are interested in helping to set up an apartment prior to a family's arrival, please contact PEGGY SWALM who can put you in touch with the coordinators at the International Institute of Minnesota. 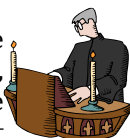
